



# After-hours Parking and Transportation at UNC

## After-hours Parking

### Unrestricted Parking after 5:00 PM and 9:00 PM

Many lots on campus offer unrestricted parking on weekends and after 5:00 PM on weekdays, and still others offer parking after 9:00 PM on weekdays. Information denoting hours of operation is printed on the signs at the entrances to each specific lot. Motorists should never park in disability spaces, fire lanes, and other reserved spaces. A map showing after-hours availability of parking on the UNC campus as well as Point-to-Point shuttle stops is printed on the reverse side of this flyer. Parking may be restricted due to special events.

### Hourly Parking

The Morehead Lots offers extended hours of operation Monday - Wednesday, 7:30 a.m. until 12:00 a.m. (midnight), Thursday and Friday, 7:30 a.m. until 3:00 a.m., Saturday, 3:00 p.m. until 3:00 a.m. and Sunday, 3:00 p.m. until 12:00 a.m. The Swain Lot is open Monday - Wednesday, from 5 p.m. - 12:00 a.m., Thursday - Friday, 5 p.m. - 3:00 a.m., Saturday, 3:00 p.m. until 3:00 a.m. and Sunday, 3:00 p.m. until 12:00 a.m. Prior to 5 p.m., the Swain Lot is restricted to staff parking as directed on the entrance sign. Parking rates are \$1 - \$1.25/hour in these visitor parking lots with no maximum cap. UNC One Card holders can display their card when exiting and pay \$0.75 per hour.

With the exception of the Rams Head Deck, employees, contract employees, and students are not eligible to park in areas designated for visitors unless attending a medical appointment. Parking is available in Rams Head for up to 24 hours at a time.

### Metered Space Parking

Intended for general use, metered spaces in most areas at UNC are U.S. coin (quarters only) or debit key-activated weekdays, from 7:30 AM - 9 PM. Cash keys may be obtained from the Department of Public Safety at a \$10.00 minimum without a maximum denomination, upon payment of a \$20.00 deposit. Meter parking is \$1.25 per hour, and the maximum time for occupying these metered parking spaces is three hours. Short-term meters on campus, however, are activated at 50¢ per half-hour, and the maximum time for metered parking in these spaces is thirty minutes.

### Faculty / Staff Parking

The Steele and Caldwell Lots (NG3 Zone) are designated for employee parking on weekdays after 5:00 PM. Those with NG3 or other valid permits for these areas may park in these lots between 7:30 AM and 8 PM. Employees without a permit for these lots should apply for the appropriate permit to allow parking between 5 PM and 8 PM. The permit is free of charge.

**Please Note:** Visitor, night, and metered space parking may be restricted during Special Event operations. Please read signs at the entrance to all lots and obey lot monitors during special events.

## After-hours Transportation

### U and Reverse U (RU) Routes

Chapel Hill Transit bus routes, including the U and RU, are fare-free and accessible to persons with mobility impairments. The U and RU have stops that allow riders to reach any point on main campus within a two-minute walk. They circle main campus (in opposite directions) on weekdays from 7 AM - 8 PM. Maximum waiting time: fifteen minutes.

### Point-to-Point

Seven days a week from 7:00 PM until 3:00 AM during the spring and fall academic semesters (except when residence halls are closed), the P2P Express offers free transportation to all students and employees. Also, a P2P shuttle service provides service for disabled students, students going to the campus Health Services Center, and after dark, to all students NOT served by the Express route (to and from "open" campus buildings only). It also provides transportation to and from remote on-campus parking lots and the PR lot off campus. One-touch direct-line call boxes are located in the Manning (S11) Lot, Bowles (S11) Lot, Craige (CD) Deck, and the PR parking lots.

**Library/Safe Shuttle** runs continuously between 12:00 AM (Midnight) and 3:00 AM, Monday through Thursday. It links the Library/Student Union (South Road entrance) with campus housing locations and fraternities and sororities on Franklin St. and S. Columbia St.

### Safe Ride

The Safe Ride program is a student-run organization that aims to improve the general safety at UNC by working with local public safety and transportation agencies to provide increased mobility during late-night hours both on campus and off.

**JV, T and G: run Thurs. - Sat.**

**Safe Ride J Route:** Franklin and Rosemary St., including University Commons, Rock Creek Apartments, Highland Hills, Laurel Ridge, along Merritt Mill, Smith Level Rd., Southern Village and Greensboro St.

**Safe Ride T Route:** Rosemary Streets with locations to the north of campus, Airport Rd. to Weaver Dairy Rd.

**Safe Ride G Route:** South Rd., Finley Forest, Glen Lenox to University Mall.
