



Sunday Evening PR Lot Service

A P2P minibus runs continuously between the PR parking lot and campus every 20 minutes from 11:00 p.m. until 3:00 a.m., every Sunday (after Chapel Hill Transit ceases "NU" Route service) during the academic year. Individual van service requests will not be accepted from the PR lot during these Sunday hours.

Third Bus Thursdays

To augment P2P Express service during high demand periods, a third bus runs directly between Granville Towers and south campus (Hinton James) between 10:00 p.m. and 3:00 a.m. every Thursday evening.

Suspension of Services

P2P service may be suspended at certain times during normal operating hours due to weather or traffic congestion caused by special events on campus. These will normally not exceed 30 minutes after the end of an event in the Smith Center or 45 minutes after the end of an event at Kenan Stadium. P2P service may also be suspended or cancelled due to weather conditions.

CAP Emergency Ride Back

In an effort to reduce traffic congestion and the number of vehicles parked on campus, the Commuter Alternatives Program (CAP) is designed to reward UNC employees and students who do not drive a single-occupancy vehicle (SOV) to commute to campus. CAP registrants can take advantage of such incentives as Emergency Ride Back transportation, offered from campus to park and ride lots, or other locations within the Chapel Hill Carrboro city limits in situations of urgency. In an emergency, CAP participants should contact the Emergency Ride Back dispatcher (843-7671) for transportation to their own vehicles. Point-to-Point (P2P)

Point-to-Point (P2P) is operated expressly for UNC faculty, staff, and students by the UNC - Chapel Hill Department of Public Safety. Its goal is to supplement Chapel Hill Transit service. The following details the services of the Point-to-Point transportation system.

Point-to-Point Shuttles



Point-to-Point is a limited transportation system operated by the UNC Department of Public Safety, expressly for UNC faculty, staff, and students. Pick-up and drop-off points are limited to on-campus locations or specific off-campus locations owned or operated by the University. Service is also limited to the normal operating hours of that location. P2P does not offer service to buildings that are normally closed, for example, during the evening or weekend hours.

The P2P is available to transport riders to UNC main campus parking areas after dark.

After Dark

P2P operates demand-response vans for those passengers not on the P2P Express bus route. Rides may be requested by calling P2P dispatch. Passengers with pick-up and drop-off points on the Express route are NOT eligible for this van service. Both the demand-response service and P2P Express may cease operation on some University-recognized holidays. Comment Cards are available on all P2P vehicles. Riders are encouraged to provide comments and suggestions — your constructive comments are important in evaluating service needs.

Disability Service

P2P provides priority service to those affiliated with UNC who have disabilities. This service is available 24 hours a day, Monday through Friday. On Saturdays and Sundays, the disability shuttle runs from 9:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. For more information, visit the student disability services site at www.disabilityservices.unc.edu or the employee site at www.unc.edu.depts.eooada/

Eligibility for P2P disability services requires a P2P Disability Card. Students may obtain a disability card from either

Student Health Services or UNC Disability Services. Staff and faculty may obtain a disability card from the Parking Services Office of the Department of Public Safety or from UNC Disability Services. Resident students with approved disability cards will be provided transportation from their residence halls to campus locations. Staff and faculty with disability cards will be provided transportation to and from campus parking lots and their workplaces. Those with disability cards will be provided transportation to and from campus locations for meetings or other University functions. P2P vehicles include special vans equipped with wheelchair lifts. One or more is available at all times during which P2P is in service.

Reservations for Disabled Riders

Advance reservations can be made by those riders requiring a wheelchair, a riding device, crutches, or other orthopedic appliances. However, missing three reservations in a month will result in the revocation of reservation privileges for the remainder of the semester. Reservations may be accepted up to two hours prior to an actual pick-up time.

Student Health Shuttle

Transportation to and from campus locations and the Student Health Service or UNC Hospitals' Emergency Room is available to students during all hours of operation.

NOTE: Emergency conditions requiring treatment en route or dealing with bleeding issues should be addressed to the Orange County EMS service (call 911).

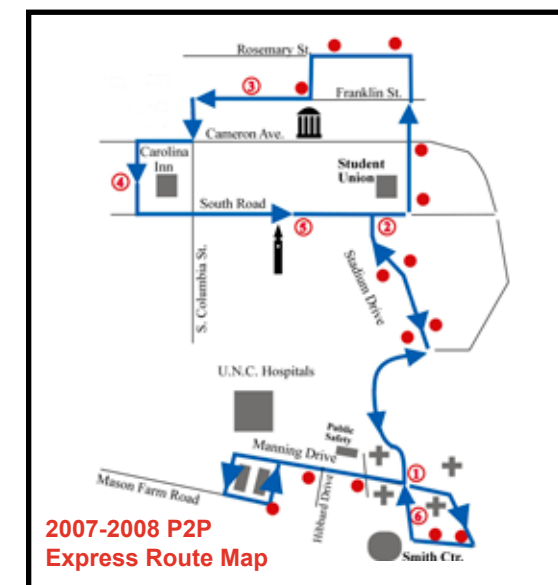
Library Safe Ride Shuttle

A shuttle will run continuously between midnight and 3:00 a.m., Monday through Thursday. It links the Student Union with campus housing locations (including Granville Towers and fraternities and sororities close to campus).

P2P Express

P2P operates an evening, free fixed-route bus service for all UNC students and employees called the P2P Express from 7:00 p.m. until 3:00 a.m., seven days a week during the fall and spring academic semesters. P2P Express does NOT run during summer semesters. P2P Express also ceases operation on University-recognized holidays during which residence halls are closed. The P2P Express Schedule:

When boarding, students should be ready to show their University I.D.; employees may be asked to show a UNCONe card as verification of employment at UNC. P2P Express vehicles serve all pick-up points continuously during operational hours, serving individual stops according to the following schedule (the service schedule may be altered during special events on campus).

1. Ehrlinghaus	:00, :15, :30, and :45
2. Union	:05, :20, :35, and :50
3. Franklin St. (Varsity Theater)	:10, :25, :40, and :55
4. Fraternity Court	:00, :15, :30, and :45
5. South Road	:06, :21, :36, and :51

Pick-up times at other stops shown on the following map may be estimated by comparing the service at the time stops listed above.

It is not necessary to call and request service to board the P2P Express. The Express serves a regular route on a regular, fixed schedule (see the Express route map) and stops only at pick-up points marked by signs on campus at the designated locations.
