

belongings have been taken to student's rooms, they (or their family/friends) should then move cars to non-unloading spaces elsewhere in the parking area and then return to their rooms to unpack. Motorists will not need a permit to park in these non-unloading spaces on Saturday or Sunday, but will need a temporary permit from DPS for parking in these spaces on other days. For complete move-in information, please visit the DPS and Housing websites.

NOTE: Campus motorists should prepare for traffic delays and congestion during move-in operations.

Parking During Special Events: During special events certain campus parking lots may be reserved. Please check the parking lot signs at lot entrances for information on when a lot may be reserved or closed. Residence hall lots may be restricted to permit holders for that lot during events to prevent event traffic from taking up resident student parking. Vehicles without regular University parking permits for these lots may be denied access.

During the days / nights of home football games, the following lots will be cleared by towing all vehicles that remain in the lots beginning at 8:00 a.m. unless the vehicle has a special football parking permit for a specific lot. These lots are typically cleared for reserved football permit parking:

During days /nights of home mens' basketball games, certain lots are typically cleared beginning at 5:00 PM on weeknights and 10:00 AM on weekends by towing all vehicles unless the vehicle has a special basketball parking permit for a specific lot, unless otherwise posted.

Other lots are subject to be included in the event towing procedures. Additionally, do NOT move cones, barricades, or signs in order to park. Such items specify temporary

parking restrictions, and the removal of these items and parking of a vehicle may cause the illegally-parked vehicle to be cited and / or towed. **Always check lot entrance signs for specific restrictions.**

NOTE: For up-to-date information on special event operations, call 962-3951 24-hours a day or log onto the DPS website at www.dps.unc.edu and check under the Breaking News or Special Events links.

Visitor Parking

There are seven visitor parking areas on the UNC campus: the **Rams Head Deck**, the **Morehead Planetarium Lot**, the **Hill Alumni Center Lot**, the **Highway 54 Lot** and the **Swain Lot**. Parking rates are \$1.25/hour in these lots. The **Ambulatory Care Lot (ACC)** and the **Dogwood Parking Deck** are \$1. Overnight parking is allowed in the Dogwood Deck only. The maximum limit for Rams Head Deck is twenty-four hours.

Visitor lots are reserved for visitors only. UNC affiliates (faculty, staff, and students) are prohibited from using campus visitor lots during daytime operation hours, with the exception of the Rams Head Deck, which provides short-term parking for students/employees unless reserved for an event. Affiliates may use the Health Care visitor lots during daytime operations, if they have an appointment or are visiting patients. An affiliate permit is required during these visits and is available at the office in the Dogwood Visitor Deck, at the Dept. of Public Safety, or by visiting the DPS website.

Metered Parking: Intended for general use, metered spaces in most areas at UNC are U.S. coin (quarters only) or debit key-activated weekdays, from 7:30 a.m. - 9:00 p.m. Cash keys may be obtained from the Department of Public Safety at a \$10.00 minimum without a maximum denomination, upon payment of a \$15.00 deposit. Three-hour meters require \$1.25 per hour for activation. The maximum time allowed at most meters is three hours. However, short-term meters exist where the maximum activation time is thirty minutes. Metered spaces may be restricted during Special Event operations.

Motorist Assistance Program

Motorist Assistance Program (UNC MAP) offers battery jump-starts and lockout/key retrievals free of charge to campus motorists, excluding those in town park & ride lots. Just contact the Parking Control Division at 962-8006 for MAP service.

All parking and traffic regulations are enforced at all times unless otherwise posted.

Parking in Fire Lanes

It is unlawful to park in a fire lane at any time. If you must park in a fire lane for any reason, you must leave a licensed driver with the vehicle, and the vehicle must move immediately if the fire alarms sound or emergency vehicles respond. There are no exceptions. Hazard lights or notes will not prevent the issuance of a parking citation. Vehicles parked in a fire lane may be towed in addition to being cited. Payment for both a citation and tow, plus payment for any outstanding fines must be remitted to DPS prior to the release of a towed vehicle.

Counterfeit Permits

Parking permits are not for transfer, duplication, or gift. Permits are not valid unless purchased from DPS, and they are not to be sold or transferred to another individual. Such permits will be confiscated without refund, a \$200 citation will be issued, the vehicle will be immobilized (booted) or impounded at an additional fee, and the motorists will be ineligible for a permit for one year. Anyone finding a permit should return it to DPS. Anyone found using a lost or stolen permit is subject to a \$200.00 fine, vehicle impoundment (and fees), suspension of parking privileges, and potential police prosecution.

Parking Fine Payment

Parking citations not paid within 10 calendar days of issuance will result in a late fee of \$10.00 being assessed on each citation. After 30 calendar days, unpaid citations may be payroll deducted from UNC and UNC Healthcare employees' paychecks. For information on the status of your account, call DPS Accounts Receivable at 962-5021 or 962-7143. **If a vehicle is towed or booted, the full amount of all fines / payments owed to DPS must be paid prior to the release of the vehicle.** Payment arrangements must be made during regular business hours. An appeal is NOT a substitute for payment.

If any vehicle receives more than 5 citations in a twelve-month period, twice in 30 days with the balance of the fines unpaid, or owing more than \$250.00 in unpaid fines, the vehicle is subject to impoundment

(and associated fees). The owner of the vehicle is subject to cancellation of any parking permit and suspension of parking privileges.

Don't Believe These Parking Myths:

- **Hazard Lights** – It is unlawful to leave a vehicle unattended with hazard lights on. It will NOT be honored in lieu of a permit or prevent a citation from being issued.
- **Notes** – Leaving a note on your vehicle will not stop it from being cited.
- **Free Parking During Breaks/Exams** – Parking regulations are always in effect as specified by lot signs.

Appeals

Any person cited for the violation of any portion of the Traffic and Parking Ordinance for which a fee is imposed may appeal the citation and /or towing or "booting" on the appropriate appeals form in person or in writing at the Public Safety Building Appeals Office. Alternatively, appeals may be made via the DPS website (www.dps.unc.edu) or sent through the mail. All appeals must be postmarked within 10 calendar days of citation issuance to the Chancellor's designated Hearing Officer. If the Hearing Officer denies the appeal, then the appellant may appeal in writing to the Chancellor within 10 calendar days of the date of the Hearing Officer's decision. The Chancellor may delegate to a committee or other body the authority to hear appeals on his or her behalf. Adverse Weather

The operations of the UNC and UNC Healthcare Systems continue during all types of weather. In cases of moderate to heavy snow, sleet, or ice accumulation, or threat of otherwise severe weather (i.e., hurricane), information regarding parking regulations on campus and changes to transit services may be available at the DPS website www.dps.unc.edu or on the UNC Emergency and **Adverse Weather Hotline at 843-1234**. Motorists may also tune to local radio (or *UNC Travelers' Information* broadcasts at 1610 AM) and local TV for adverse weather bulletins.

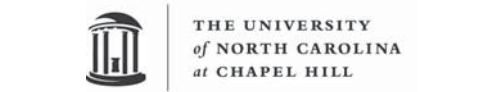

Parking Availability

Parking resources at UNC are limited – there are only 2,882 parking permits available to the entire student population. There are numerous alternative methods of transportation to explore prior to attempting to purchase on-campus parking for a single-occupancy vehicle.

Transportation Options

Chapel Hill Transit – www.chtransit.org, operates fare-free, and serves the University and surrounding communities of Chapel Hill and Carrboro.

Triangle Transit Authority – www.ridetta.org provides bus service that connects Chapel Hill to Raleigh, Durham, Cary, the Research Triangle Park, the area's universities and hospitals, and the Raleigh-Durham International Airport.

Ride Sharing – UNC and TTA are working together to help UNC students explore carpooling opportunities. For more information on carpooling, visit the DPS website at www.dps.unc.edu or visit www.redefinetravel.org. You may also call 485-RIDE (TTA) or 962-3951 (UNC).

Biking & Walking – Bike or walk to campus and keep in shape. Bicycle racks are located throughout the campus. Bicycle permits are required. The permits are free and are available at the Public Safety Building or online at <http://www.dps.unc.edu/dps/alternatives/bikeregistration.asp>.

Zipcar – Students 18 years of age and older can now join Zipcar for \$35 a year. There is no application fee, no monthly minimum and no security deposit. Fuel is free! The rental fee is \$5 per hour or \$55 per day. So, go ahead and leave fuel, insurance and maintenance costs to Zipcar. Use Zipcar for short or long trips, and for both business and personal trips.

Commuter Alternatives Program (CAP)

UNC's Commuter Alternative Program earns the University a Best Workplace for Commuters designation. In an effort to reduce traffic congestion and the number of vehicles parked on campus, the Commuter Alternatives Program (CAP) is designed to reward UNC employees and commuting students who do not drive a single-occupancy vehicle (SOV) to commute to campus. The program is free and only requires that a student live more than 2 miles from the Bell Tower and walk, bike, carpool, park and ride or take the bus to campus and does not hold a paid, on campus permit.

Student CAP registrants with dependent family members can take advantage of such incentives as Emergency Ride Back transportation, offered from campus to park and ride lots or other local sites in situations of urgency. In an emergency, CAP participants contact the Emergency Ride Back dispatcher (843-7671). For more information, call DPS at 962-3951 or visit the DPS website at www.dps.unc.edu. If you commute from outside Chapel Hill and Carrboro, contact TTA about their Emergency Ride Home program.

Local Transit and Park & Ride

Chapel Hill Transit offers extensive fare free service in and around UNC, and to all Town and CAP park and ride lots. Routes are fare-free for all riders all the time. For route, schedule and other transit

service information, call the Chapel Hill Transit office at 969-4900 or consult the Chapel Hill Transit website at www.chtransit.org.

Triangle Transit Authority

Regional transit in the Triangle area is provided by a system of bus routes operated by the Triangle Transit Authority (TTA) connects Raleigh, Durham, Chapel Hill, Cary, Research Triangle Park (RTP), the area's many universities and hospitals, and Raleigh-Durham International Airport. Triangle Transit Authority's in the Park Service Center, in RTP serve as the transfer point. Individual route maps and schedules can be found on TTA's website, www.ridetta.org, at the TTA offices (485-RIDE), through the UNC-Chapel Hill Department of Public Safety and the UNC Hospital Parking office.

UNC provides free annual TTA bus passes to commuting students who are Commuter Alternatives Program participants. These passes also give free access to the Durham transit systems. These passes are available in the Public Safety Building and the UNC Hospital Parking office..

The Point-to-Point Shuttle

Seven days a week during the fall and spring academic semesters (except on University holidays or when residence halls are closed), the **P2P Express** offers free, fixed-route campus transportation to students and employees during fall and spring academic semesters. The P2P Express operates from 7:00 p.m. - 3:00 a.m. For a detailed route map and up-to-date schedule, see the Point-to-Point Brochure, visit the DPS website, or call a P2P dispatcher at 962-7867.

The Point-to-Point On-Demand shuttle service provides *daytime* transportation for students going to the Student Health Services Center. This service also provides transportation for all disabled students and employees.

After dark, P2P provides on demand transportation to campus locations not served by the P2P Express route. **After dark** service is only provided to and from any campus building that is "open." It also provides transportation to and from remote parking lots and the "PR" lot off campus. One-touch direct-line call boxes are located in the Manning (S11) Lot, Bowles (S11) Lot, Craige (CD) Deck, and "PR" parking lots. On-demand service is

provided 24 hours a day during weekdays and from 9:00 a.m. through 5:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. on weekends.

Bicycle Travel at UNC



Bicycle parking is available throughout the campus and is designated by the presence of bicycle racks or specifically designated parking areas. Restrictions governing bicycle parking are outlined in The Traffic and Parking Ordinance, and are in effect at all times. Employees and students of UNC and UNC Healthcare are required to display a bicycle registration permit (affix to bike as shown). This permit is issued free of charge upon the completion of a bicycle registration form found in the Bike Registration Brochure available at the Department of Public Safety and on the DPS website. The second failure to display this permit results in a \$5 fine. Subsequent failures result in a \$10 fine for each violation.

Pedestrian Safety

As is true for all modes of transportation, pedestrian should exercise caution when travelling the campus. Drivers too, should exercise common sense and courtesy when interfacing with pedestrians. Guidelines are listed below. For more information, call the Pedestrian Hotline at 843-7337 (PEDS).

Pedestrians

- Stay clear of construction areas. Use designated detours including adjusted roadway crossings.
- Cross the street within the crosswalk. Be alert! Watch all lanes you must cross.
- Do not assume drivers can stop.
- Do not assume a driver has seen you. Establish eye contact before crossing.
- If you cross the street at a place other than a designated crosswalk or intersection, remember that the vehicle has the right-of-way.
- Use good judgment. Just having the right-of-way will not prevent injuries.

Drivers

- Be attentive when entering a crosswalk area. Drivers must stop for pedestrians crossing at a crosswalk.
- Do not overtake and pass other vehicles stopped for pedestrians.



- If you are making a turn with a green light, a pedestrian crossing with the same green light has the right-of-way.
- A pedestrian passing through an uncontrolled intersection has the right-of-way.
- Failure to yield to a pedestrian in a marked crosswalk is a violation of North Carolina law.

Police Call Boxes

There are over 100 UNC Police Emergency Call-Boxes located on campus. Pushing the button on the Police Call-Box immediately puts one in contact with the UNC Police and also activates the flashing blue light on top of the call box. Do not stay at the call box if you feel threatened – a UNC Police vehicle will be dispatched even if you do not respond. Use the call box to report any activity on campus you find suspicious.

Permit Parking 2007-08

Student Parking Permit Eligibility: To be eligible for a campus commuter parking permit, commuting students must live outside a two-mile air radius as measured from the Bell Tower (student addresses are verified in August for compliance with this ruling). A valid vehicle registration card and proof of liability insurance (insurer, policy #, exp. date) must be shown at the time of the permit purchase. To be eligible for a resident parking permit, students must reside in a UNC residence hall.

Freshmen are not eligible for campus parking permits. Freshmen may only be granted special parking privileges upon approval from the Office of Student Affairs (962-8300). Only significant parking hardships will be reviewed.

Student Hardship Applications are available at Suite C of the Student Union, at the Public Safety Building, or they can be downloaded from DPS website www.dps.unc.edu. Applications should be returned to the Student Government offices in Suite C of the Student Union. The deadline for accepting applications will be 5 p.m. on Wednesday, August 29. The list of those students receiving permits will be posted on Friday, September 7 at 5:00 p.m., on the door of the Union's Suite C, and on the DPS website. Questions about the hardship application and requests for temporary hardship permits may be directed ONLY to Student Government Offices (962-5201). Freshmen are not eligible for the Student Government Hardship permit process.

Student Permit Sales: Parking pre-registration occurs during April and May prior to the new permit year; specific dates are posted on the DPS website. Permits not assigned may be available for sale Tuesday, August 21, 2007. Students should check the availability of permits at the DPS website – www.dps.unc.edu. Over the counter availability will be posted one week prior to

the sale of the permits. There is rarely any availability except through the waiting list. Students are encouraged to sign up on the permit waiting list (see information below). Parking for some Graduate School programs is coordinated independently of general student parking. Law School students should contact the Dean of Student Affairs at 962-7813. Third and fourth year medical students should contact the Medical School at 962-8335. Business School grads may call 962-1643 (MAC) or 962-0776 (MBA).

The Student Wait List: DPS offers a waiting list for student permits. Applications are available at the Public Safety Building and on the DPS website. If you received notice that you were placed on the waiting list through pre-registration, please check your position upon returning to campus or on the DPS website. The first waiting list will be released to eligible students on Thursday, June 21, 2007. The second waiting list release will be posted at PSB and on the DPS website on Friday, August 25, 2007. The waiting list is posted on Fridays at 5:00 p.m. every other week. If you have a space released from the waiting list, you have two weeks to pick up the permit.

A Note on Accounts: All outstanding accounts must be cleared before new permits can be issued. This applies to students, employees, outside agencies and University departments. Students and departments must pay outstanding balances *in full*. DPS reserves the right to reduce or retain any refund owed for cancelled permits for payment against any outstanding balance. Outstanding balances can be viewed on the DPS website on the "Account Information" page.

Special Event Parking

Fall, 2007 Move-in: Thursday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday Monday August 15-19, a special move-in operation will be in effect on campus. In some cases, University Housing may allow resident students to move in earlier. At most of the residence halls, spaces will be held for "unloading" during these times.

Students have thirty-five minutes to unload their vehicles. These spaces are reserved for short-term unloading only. Once
